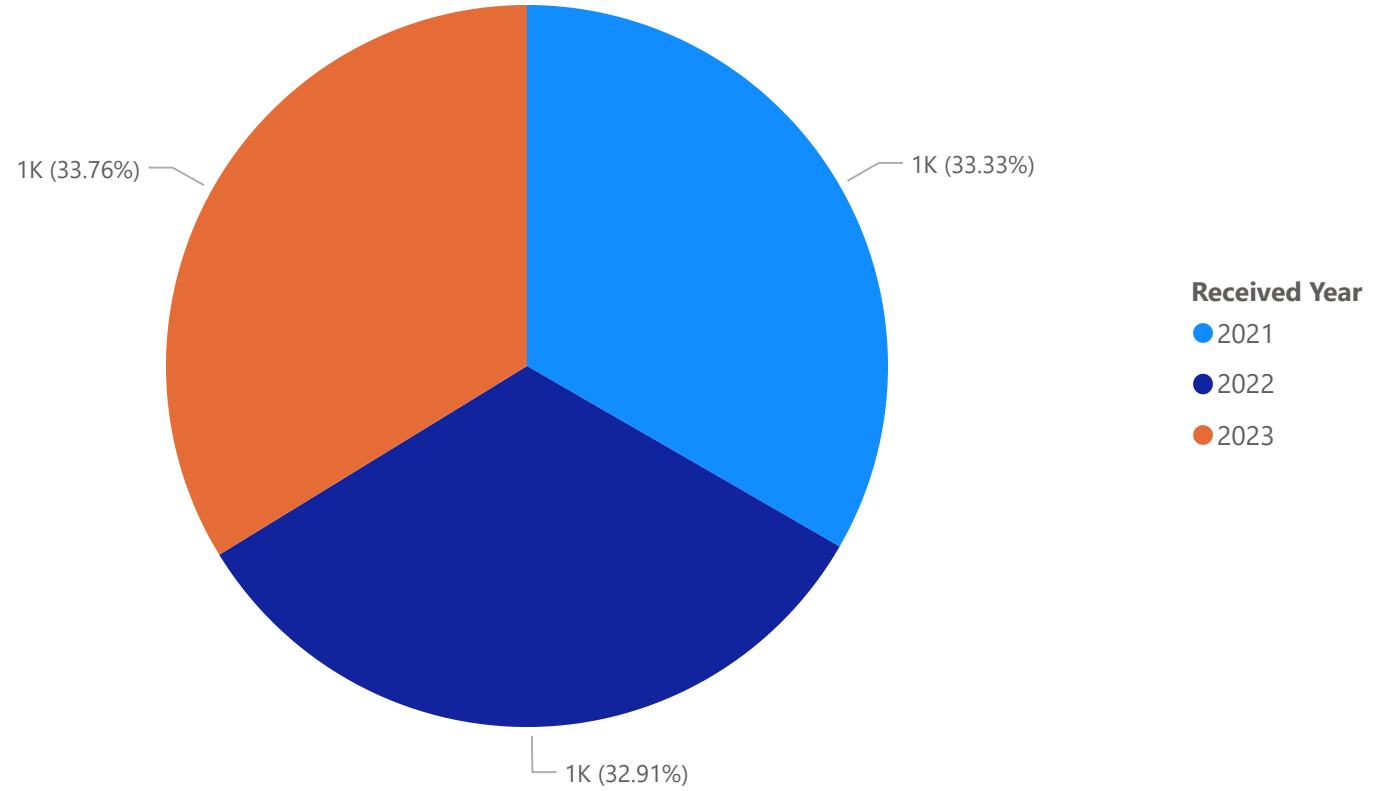

Incident Reporting Count by Received Year

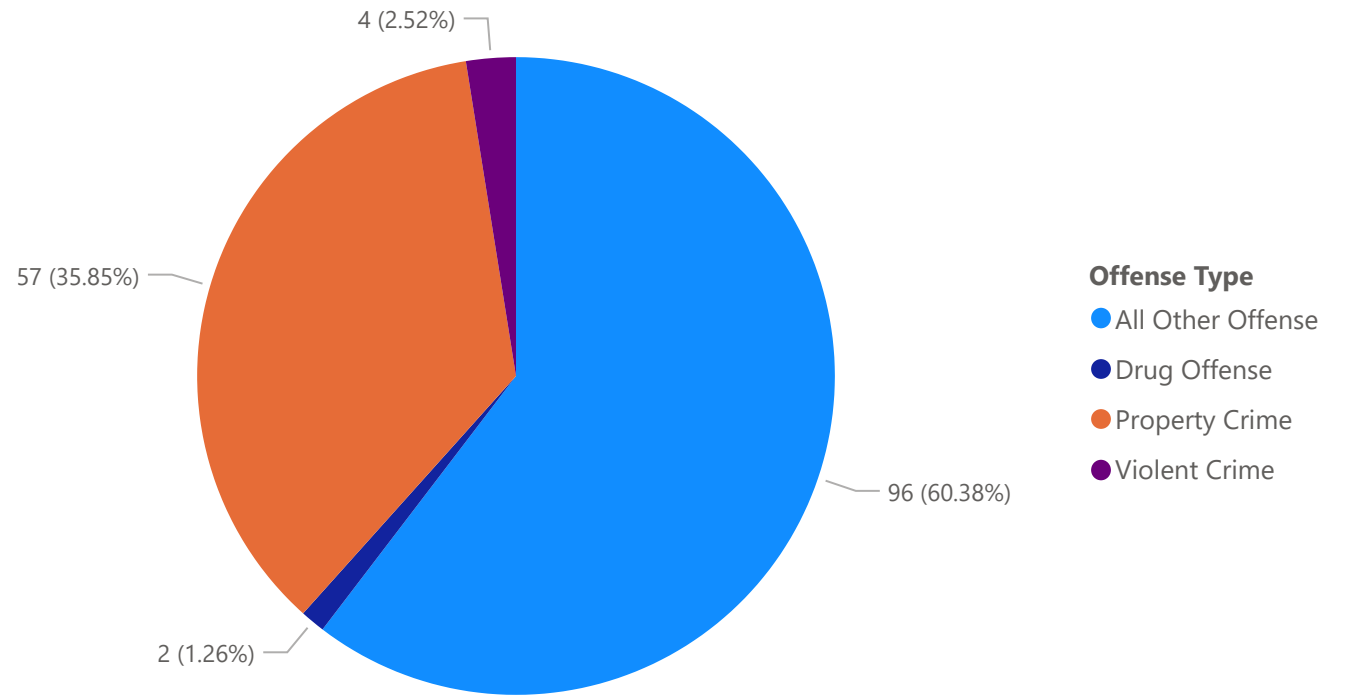

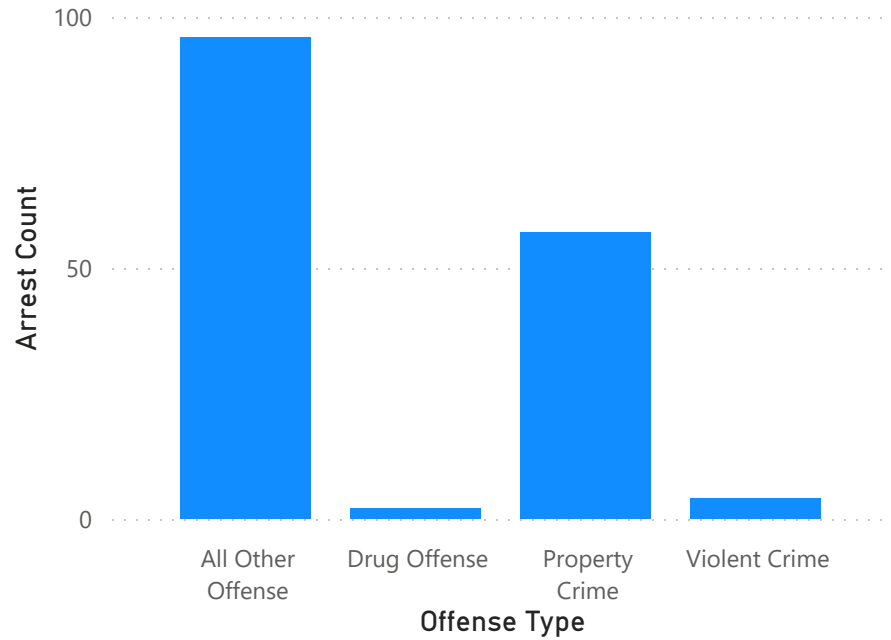

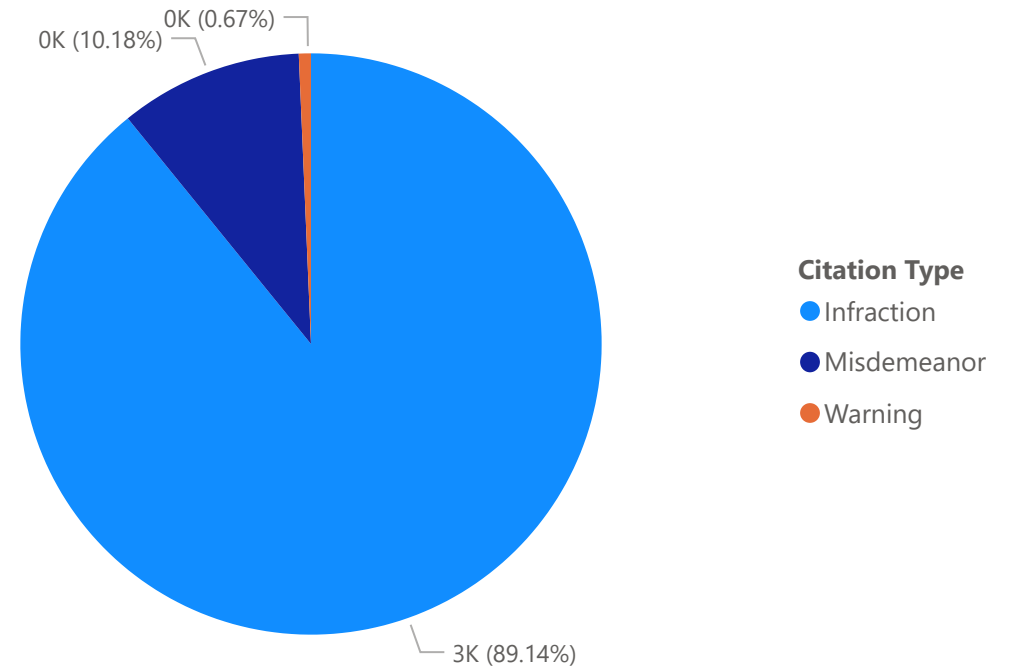

Total Citations by Citation Year

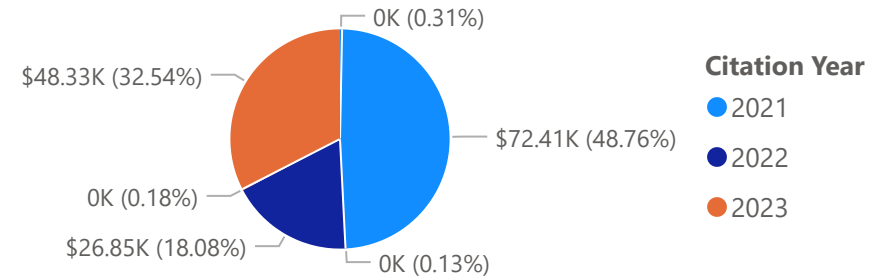

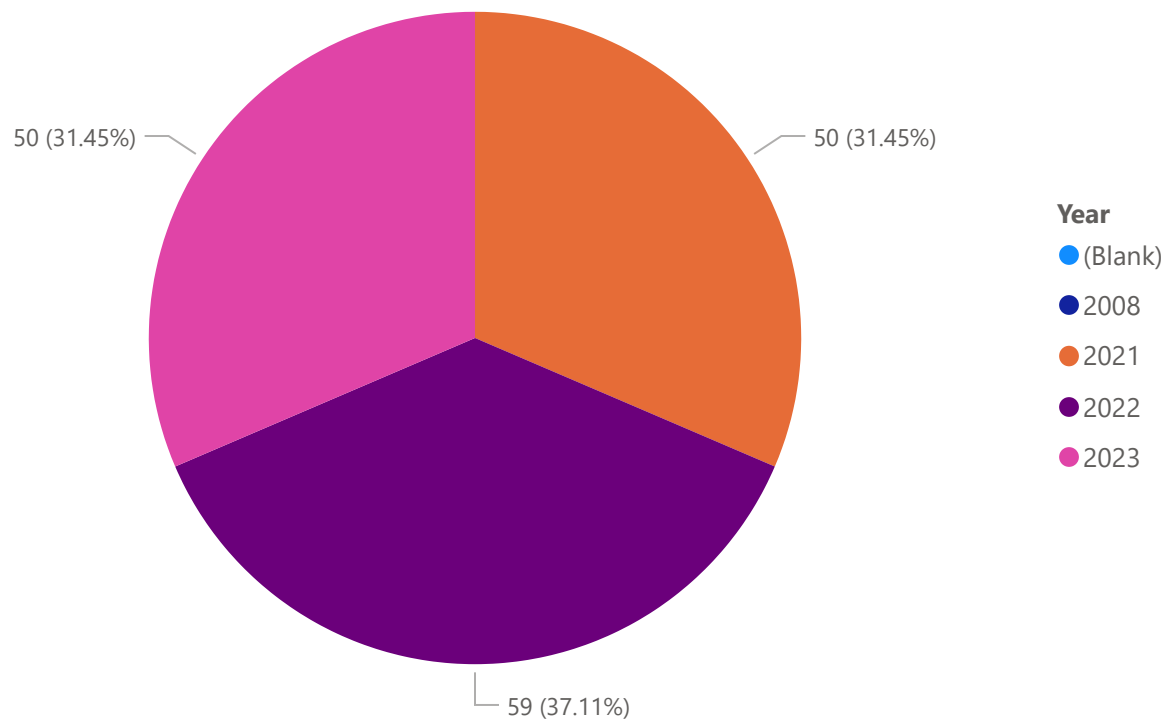
Incident Reporting Count by Received Year

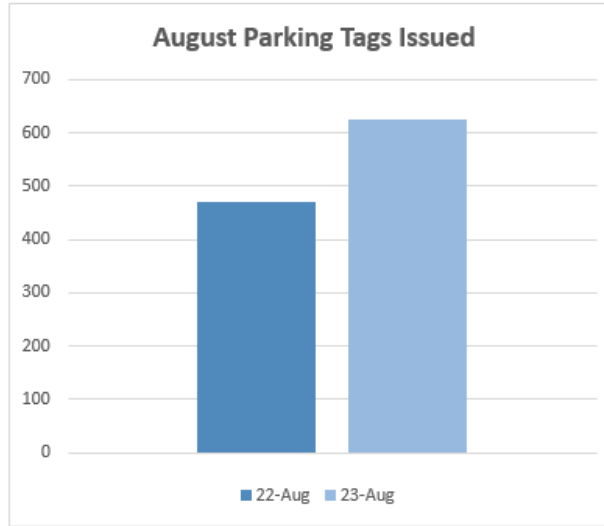

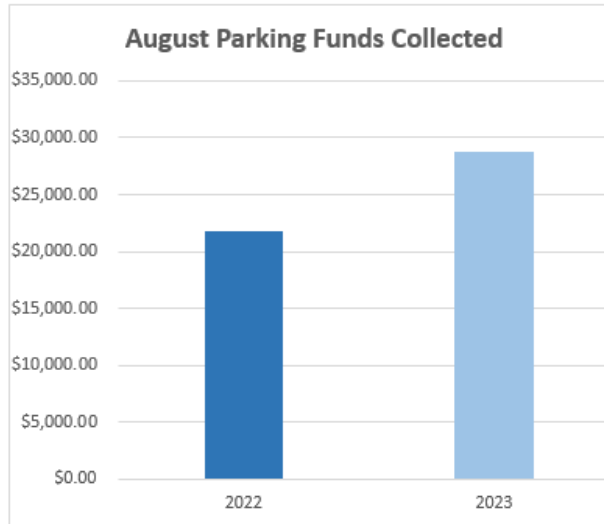

- Complaints: 81

- Euthanized: 1 sick cat from Seymour brought to Fairfield. Untreatable, euthanized.

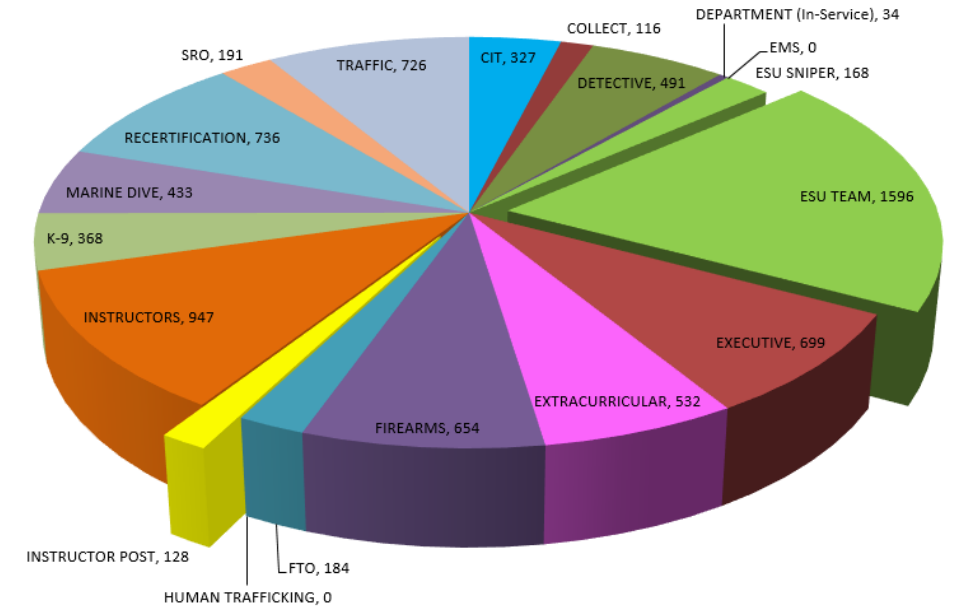

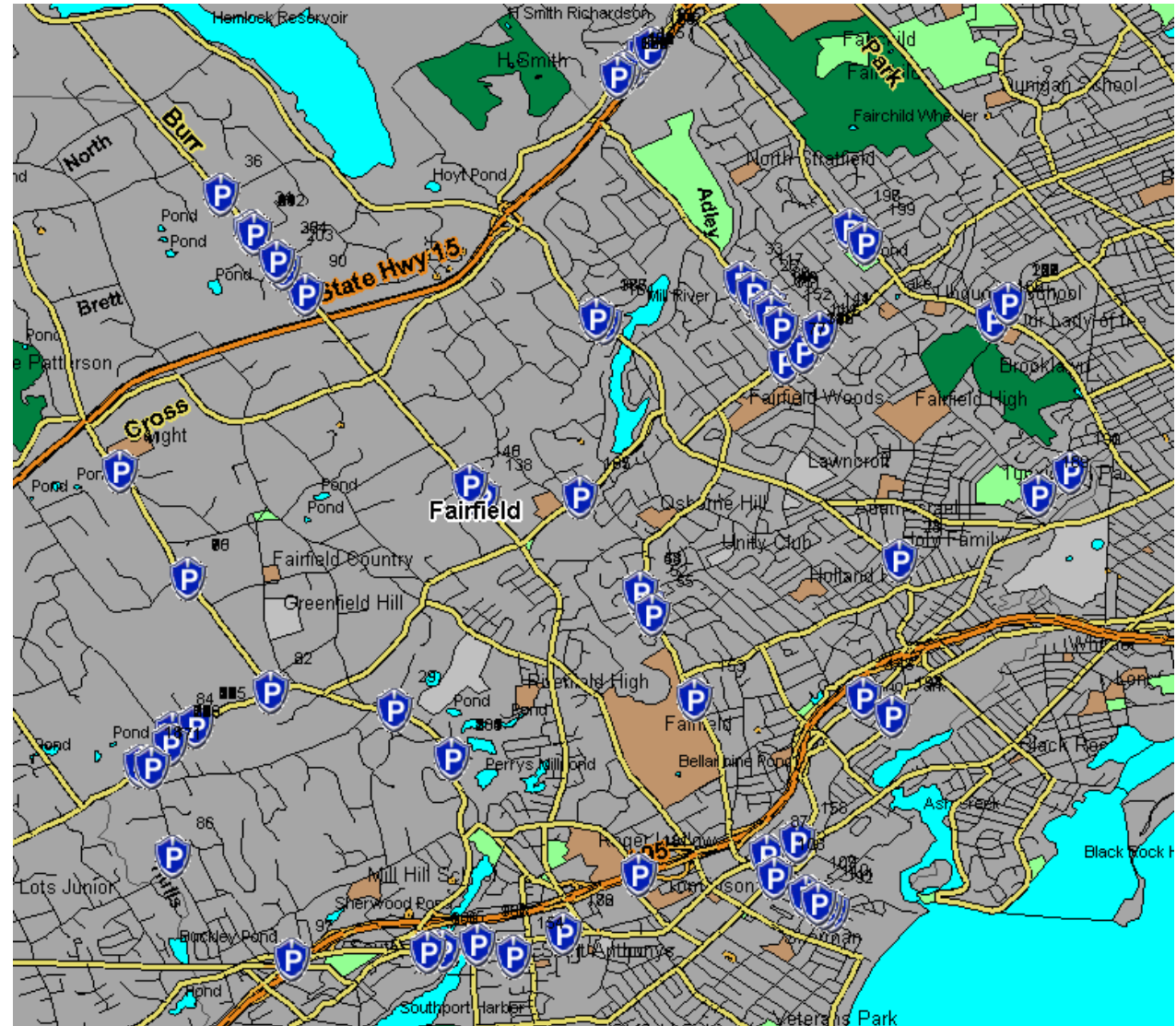
