Noteworthy Police Work

16-36021 | 1:40 PM | Officer Wells | Commerce Dr/ Bridgeport Town line

Officer Wells on routine patrol stopped a vehicle after a check revealed it was unregistered. During the stop it was discovered the operator was in possession of narcotics and subsequently charged.

Further investigation revealed the operator had an outstanding felony warrant for possession of narcotics out of Norwalk. Suspect turned over to Norwalk PD.

Dispatch received a cell phone call from a female whispering that she and a friend need help with no known location. ECC dispatchers DiJoseph and Champney seamlessly executed a plan to locate the subject based on 911 GPS coordinates near Fairfield University Campus. They began a 'ping' protocol with the cellular provider.

Officers responded to Fairfield University Campus activating their strobe lights in hopes the caller would see the police but received negative results. Officers activated their sirens until such time the ECC could hear the siren over the 911 call and the nearest officer checked the area on foot. Two female students were located on the campus grounds highly intoxicated. Both students were transported to area hospitals.

Officer Zerella on routine patrol observed two suspects involved in prior thefts from landscaping trucks after Detective Takacs put out a flyer on the suspect vehicle. The vehicle was stopped for misuse of registration plates.

On scene investigation led to the search of the vehicle and a large knife and a wax fold of Heroin was discovered. Both the male and female occupants were arrested and charged with multiple offenses in addition to motor vehicle charges.

- ECC reported a maroon Chevy Impala bearing New Jersey plates was involved in a hit and run accident at Commerce Drive and Duka Ave.
- Officer Renaldi located the vehicle and was in pursuit of it heading south on I-95.
- Renaldi terminated the pursuit when the vehicle refused to stop, suspect vehicle put out on the hot line.
- State Police observed the above vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on I-95 south in the area of exit 18 and engaged in pursuit of the vehicle.
- State Police reported that they terminated the pursuit
- State Police indicated over the hotline that the vehicle was heading back towards Fairfield on the Post Rd. Officer Deangelis was standing at Post Road and Center Street (Southport) with stop sticks.
- Deangelis observed a vehicle coming east bound on the Post Rd. (estimated speed between 80-100MPH).
- The vehicle lost control at the intersection of Post Road and Old Post Road and struck the curb causing the right wheel to break off and spin 180 degrees before coming to rest.
