A regular virtual meeting of the Board of Police Commissioners will be held on Wednesday, September 9, 2020 at 4:30 p.m.

T.S. #1 Location: Ash Creek Boulevard – Metro Train Station. Nature of request: request for an Administrative Decision Review - Crossing at Fairfield/Fairfield Metro Train Station, Ash Creek Boulevard, Fairfield, Connecticut - OSTA #050-0503-01. By whom: Michael A. Galante. Recommendation: review with Town Attorney whether to prepare a Memorandum of Understanding. If a traffic light is installed, it will be at the developer's expense.

T.S. #2 Location: Black Rock Turnpike Bridge via north side – Lake Hills Members. Nature of request: request that the Police Commission make a request to the state (since it is a state road) to also post signs on the bridge advising that jumping and swimming from the bridge is not permitted. By whom: Donald Kleber. Recommendation: approve.

T.S. #3 Location: Ruane Street between (at) Post Road and Oldfield Road. Nature of request: request a 4-way stop sign at the corner of Ruane Street, Paul Place and Welsh Terrace due to excessive speeding on Ruane Street especially around the curve at Paul Place and Welsh Terrace. Also, request input as to what might work - "Slow Down", "Children At Play", "Bus Stop", "Pedestrian Crossing", or "Hidden Driveway" sign at the curve. By whom: Erin Linnane. Recommendation: on the north and southbound side curve ahead sign to be moved further north away and further south away from turn.

T.S. #4 Location: Rugby Road at South Pine Creek Road. Nature of request: request to install "Dead End" sign on the right side of Rugby Road. By whom: Janet Tursosky. Recommendation: approve "Dead End" sign.

T.S. #5 Location: Mason Street. Nature of Request: Mason Street is 16.5 feet wide between the concrete curbs. Neighbors have no on site parking and it seems they fill the road with cars and make it impossible for emergency vehicles. At the beginning of Mason Street there are commercial vehicles parked on the road that do not move. I request "No Parking" signs be installed on this portion of Mason Street. By whom: Dennis Brown. Recommendations: approve to relocate "No Parking" 25 feet away from "Stop" sign. Owner to trim back hedge on the west side of the street.

T.S. #6 Location: Stonybrook Road and Rock Major Road (Tanaka Park Association). Request: request "Stop" sign on Rock Major Road at the corner of Rock Major Road and Stonybrook Road. Request three (3) "Stop" signs at the three-way intersection of Rock Major and Stonybrook. The "Children Playing" sign is there now but almost every single day it is knocked down. Request an island to slow traffic at the intersection and solve the blind turn up Stonybrook. Request speed bumps on Rock Major and Stonybrook to lower the emissions impact of a safety solution while providing a reduction in speed. By whom: Danielle Dallau. Recommendations: approve three (3) "Stop" signs at three-way intersection of Rock Major Road and Stonybrook Road.

T.S #7 Location: Hulls Highway at/between Ivy Lane and Post Road. Nature of request: excessive speeding on Hulls Highway. Request for traffic study on ways to prevent speeding. Remove blocked trees in front of speed signs. Increase number of speed signs and size of the speed signs, stronger police presence, increased speeding fine, and a 3-way "Stop" sign on Hulls Highway and Gray Rock Road. By whom: Jesse Rosenbaum. Recommendation: deny 3-Way "Stop" sign.
