### **Section 1: Bureau / Division Reports**

#### **Noteworthy Police Work**

Sgt. Gunter recognized Officer Renaldi for his work identifying and making the arrest of a subject that was attempting to use a counterfeit credit card. The arrest led to further charges for using counterfeit cards at other locations in town.

Sgt. Zdru recognized Officer Quiles after the officer observed a suspicious car driving on Post Road. The occupants parked the car and ran from the vehicle as Officer Quiles turned around to investigate the vehicle. The occupants were later located. They were found to have been involved in thefts from motor vehicles.

Lt. Bloch recognized Sgt. Riendeau for his work in identifying a suspect in several theft from motor vehicles.

Sgt. Paris recognized Officer Sudora for his work enforcing commercial motor vehicle laws. He has made several arrests for overweight trucks. One stop resulted in the arrest of the driver who was wanted for a violation of parole on robbery charges.

Lt. Bloch recognized Officer Matejek, Officer DeAngelis and Sgt. Riendeau for their work locating a stolen vehicle and making an arrest of one of the occupants. The arrest resulted in connecting the suspects to multiple stolen vehicles and car break-ins that occurred across the state.

Lt. Bloch recognized Officer Renaldi, Officer Ricco, Officer Demotses, Officer Quiles and Sergeant Riendeau . These officers responded to a report of a suspicious person at a car dealership. They were able to locate the suspect and through a thorough investigation linked the suspect to several crimes.

Officer Bennett responded to an unresponsive female in a white Ford Escape in the parking lot of Shop Rite.

- Officer Bennett arrived on scene to find AMR administering CPR.
- AMR also administered a Narcan and shortly after the female became responsive
- The female would not disclose what she had taken.
- AMR transported to St. Vincent's Hospital

Officers responded to a 911 call of an Elderly Female Left home On Foot and Does Not Speak English

- History Of Alzheimer's / Left 20-25 Minutes Ago
- Silver Alert activation and an extensive search for the woman that included Officer Kaesmann /K-9 Maverick and multiple patrols.
- She was located uninjured at approximately 1800hrs almost three miles away in the backyard of a home. Great teamwork by all involved officers and ECC personnel.

Officers responded to a 911 call for a possible overdose

- Officers dispatched on a possible Drug O/D Heroin
- Narcan Was Administered By Fairfield Fire Dept.
- Victim became responsive and awake prior to being transported

#### <u>16-46656 | 10:55 AM | Suspicious Person | 200 Unquowa Rd</u>

Special Officer Kuroghlian on duty at the Rail road Station reported a white male checking car doors in the train station parking lot.

- Sergeant Paris located the subject on School Street just East of Tomlinson Middle School. The subject admitted to pan handling but denied touching the vehicles
- NCIC check revealed he was a Parole violator and should be detained
- Officer Wiltsie took him into custody and turned him over to Parole.

#### 16-46786 / 0430 AM / Attempted Theft of Rims and Tires/ Commerce Drive

Officers responded to Honda of Westport 251 Commerce Dr. on a report of an active alarm. Prior to arrival the alarm company observed via surveillance camera a male wearing dark clothing and a hoody standing near the bushes and a dark sedan driving through the lot.

- Multiple officers arrived on scene and Officer Renaldi located a subject about 50 feet east walking away from the dealership. The subject had evergreen needles on his pants and was wearing similar clothing.
- Officer Ricco checked the bushes in question and located a pair of black and red gloves and a black mask. The subject was positively identified by the alarm company dispatcher via surveillance camera as the person seen earlier by them.
- Officer Demotses located a dark blue, Acura, parked across the street, occupied by a
  white female. The vehicles trunk revealed two milk crates, which are commonly used to
  support vehicles after the rims are removed in addition to large breaker bars and a large
  car jack. Note: Multiple thefts of rims have occurred in Fairfield dealerships after
  midnight.
- The male was taken into custody and charged with Trespass and Conspiracy charges. The female was charged with possession of marijuana.

#### 16-47290 / 0300 AM / Stolen Vehicle in Progress/ Blake Drive

Officers were dispatched to Blake Dr. on a report of a stolen vehicle taken in the past 15 minutes. Officers observed the stolen vehicle a Toyota Prius travelling South on South Pine Creek, with no headlights lights.

- Officer Matejek attempted to stop the vehicle and the vehicle drove around his patrol car. Officer Deangelis engaged the vehicle in pursuit. The vehicle struck a curb and 2 males fled from the vehicle on foot.
- Officers engaged in a foot pursuit and the passenger was located in a rear yard and taken into custody. Fellow officers arrived on scene and a perimeter was set. A K-9 officer was requested and conducted a track for the driver. The driver was not located but a second vehicle a Lincoln Navigator was reported stolen from the immediate area. Multiple car burglaries were discovered in the area after this incident concluded.
- The suspect taken into custody was charged with multiple charges including active arrest warrants and held on bond.
- Milford Police discovered the stolen Lincoln Navigator 24 hours later abandoned in a driveway in their town. State PD K-9 responded and tracked, with negative results. Fairfield Detectives responded to process the vehicle for evidence.

#### 16-47107 / 1128 pm / EMS Overdose / I-95 Southbound Shoulder near Exit 18

State Police Troop G requests an Ambulance on I-95 Southbound between Exit 19 and 18. They report that CPR is in progress.

- Upon arrival Sergeant Gunter found (2) CSP Troopers were performing CPR on a male subject on the highway shoulder.
- They reportedly administered 2 doses of Narcan and had been performing CPR and rescue breathing for several minutes.
- Sergeant Gunter provided the Troopers with his AED unit and CPR was continued until a pulse was restored.
- The subject regained consciousness and was subsequently transported to St. Vincent's Hospital by AMR.
